A Children's Christmas Program

This Christmas program is a translation and revision of *Liturgie* für einen Kinder-Gottesdienst zur Feierder heiligen Weihnacht, a German children's Christmas program.

The Reverend Friedrich Lochner (1822-1902) originally wrote this program in 1869 for his congregation, Trinity Evangelical-Lutheran Church in Milwaukee. For several decades it was the only children's program used at Trinity Church. As late as 1949 it was hailed as "unsurpassed...in spite of the many other [children's programs] that have appeared since then."

The program's central thought can be summarized in this way. The Christian celebrates Christmas in joyful thanksgiving for the birth of Jesus Christ. God the Father promised this birth in the beginning and repeated His promise down through the ages. It was not the birth of any ordinary man, but God Himself being born a man of the Virgin Mary. This birth of the Son of God is for our good because, through the life and death and resurrection of Jesus, God offers to all mankind freedom from the guilt of sin and the fear of death.

Throughout the program the children encourage the congregation to take to heart and take comfort in our Lord's birth as the Savior of the nations. In this way this children's program is a suitable preparation for the full Christian Christmas celebration; namely, the Service of our Lord where the benefits of His birth are unmistakably distributed in the Word and Supper of our Christ.

May our Lord Jesus in His Word here presented deepen our understanding, increase our appreciation, and encourage our faithful thanksgiving for His holy and perfect birth.

Therefore, in this time of Christmas joy, it is fitting that our little children also come into His house to speak and sing of God's sweet and wonderful deeds. So let us joyfully listen to them, mingle our praise with theirs, and pray God that we become as little children; for of such is the kingdom of heaven.

Pastor	Which article of the Creed tells us about our Lord's birth?
Children	The second article about Redemption where we confess: "I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary."
Pastor Children	Who is Jesus Christ? He is "true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true Man, born of the Virgin Mary." As one person, He is both completely God and completely Man.
Pastor Children	When did He become man, or when was He born? Jesus was born when the time of God's promise was fulfilled, almost 2000 years ago.

Pastor How long was the time of God's promise or the time of God's prophecy before Christ was born?

Children About 4000 years.

So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered.
